HOW TO PROPERLY DISPOSE



DO:

- Use a pair of tongs, pliers or tweezers to pick up the needle
- Rubber gloves
- Pointing the needle tip down and away from you
- Put the needle in a hard plastic container several millimeters thick with a tight lid

DO NOT:

- touch the object
- recap
- bend
 - purposely break or remove the needle from the syringe
